A Delegation of Librarians Meets the President of Nepal



On 23 June 2022, a delegation consisting of ten prominent librarians of Nepal paid a courtesy visit to the Right Honorable President of Nepal Ms. Bidya Devi Bhandari at her office. It was for the first time in the history of Nepali library sector that the Head of state had granted an audience to the library sector team of professionals. The Rt. honourable President took a keen interest in knowing about the present scenario of Libraries and Resource centers in the country as well as the role being played by the Government and relevant organizations to uplift their overall condition.

The delegation team was led by the current President of Nepal Library Association (NLA) Mr. Indra Prasad Adhikari and was coordinated by Ms. Balika Giri, a literary journalist. The delegation was consisted of the former presidents of NLA, head of TU CDLIS, representatives of notable libraries and other prominent librarians, viz. Mr. Indra Prasad Adhikari, Mr. Murari Binod Pokhrel, Ms. Bina Vaidya, Mr. Bholu Kumar Shrestha, Mr. Juju Bhai Dangol, Ms. Nira Manandhar, Ms. Gita Giri

Thapa, Mr. Yadab Chandra Niraula, Mr. Bijaya Sharma and Ms. Kendra Fombo.

Mr. Adhikari the president of NLA, apprised the Rt. Hon. President Ms. Bidya Devi Bhandari about the overall condition of Libraries in Nepal and their significant roles in increasing Information literacy of the people. He also furnished suggestions about the necessity of a Library Act for the sustainable development of libraries in Nepal. Mr. Yadab Chandra Niraula, the Under secretary of the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST) apprised the President of the help being extended to the public libraries by MoEST. Similarly, Mr. Juju Bhai Dangol, the Founder Member of Kathmandu Valley Public Library (KVPL) spoke about the present scenario of public library system in Nepal. He also narrated the scenario of Presidential libraries in the USA as an example of how the developed nations give priority to libraries in uplifting information literacy of their people for nation-building.

The Rt. Hon. President Bhandari expressed her long-time interest in meeting with some of the prominent librarians of Nepal to get acquainted with the situation of Libraries and improvements being made in this sector. She instructed that manuscripts, books and other written documents are the intellectual heritage of the nation. She also instructed about the necessity of IT-equipped libraries for raising education levels and people's literacy for overall development of the nation. The President opined that a library should not be regarded as a non-profit organization thereby overlooking their significant and intangible contribution in nation building. In addition, she pointed out the necessity of libraries right from the local level and primary level to help inculcate reading habits in people. She also disclosed her wish to turn the present Presidential building into a library after a new building is constructed for the Presidential office. The delegation team also visited the library of the President's office and furnished advice to the library staff regarding the improvement of the library.

Participation in the 28th CDNLAO General Meeting

Nepal National Library participated in the Virtual Annual General Meeting of the 28th Conference of Directors of National Libraries in Asia and Oceania (CDNLAO) on 25 October 2022. The

theme of the conference was "Library Service Impacts on Community: Sustainability, Inclusion, and Innovation" and the discussion covered three topics- Sustainable and

Green Library Services, Community Library using Library Services, Innovative Library Services in the era of VUCA (Volatility, Uncertainty, Complexity, Ambiguity).

The 2nd National Conference on Public and Community Libraries

The Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST), Shanti Volunteer Association (SVA) and READ Nepal jointly organized two-day long 2nd National Conference on public and community libraries with support from the Government of Nepal from 29-30 June 2022 in Kathmandu to review the status of the fulfillment of the 19-point declaration statement of the first National Conference and to release the findings of the survey Report on Public and Community libraries in Nepal. New Era surveyed with the joint support of MoEST, SVA and READ Nepal. The participants representing various public and community libraries, government, university libraries, non-government organizations and several other libraries came together to share and discuss their professional experiences and to put forward their suggestions for promoting community and public libraries in Nepal. The technical session during the conference included a presentation in public and community libraries, experience sharing by library experts and an in-depth discussion on the development and promotion of library sector in Nepal. The conference concluded with 10-point Kathmandu declaration for advocacy and promotion of public and community libraries in Nepal.

15th Library Day Celebrated

The 15th Library day was celebrated on 31 August 2022 (15 Bhadra 2079 BS) conducting various programs highlighting the significance of libraries in today's society. Library day is celebrated in Nepal every year since 2008 (2065 BS) to mark the establishment of Nepal's first library by the then King of Nepal Girban Yuddha Bir Bikram Shah who had promulgated a decree on 15 Bhadra 1869 BS (1812 AD) recognizing the importance of library and books kept in his palace.

The objectives of the celebration are to promote reading habit, foster interest in library use, build a knowledge based society, develop the habit of using library in the teaching-learning process, raise public awareness on need and importance of library, encourage the establishment of public and community library in local level, help government formulate various rules and regulations for the sustainable functioning of library and library service with international standard, initiate construction and reconstruction of libraries damaged by earthquake and to promote and advocate role and importance of all kinds of libraries, academic institutions and stakeholders.

The main organizing committee for the library day celebration was formed under the convenership of Mr. Ramkrishna Subedi, Secretary, Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST); Mr. Yadab Chandra Niraula, Under Secretary of Library Co-



ordination and Documentation Section of MoEST was the Member Secretary of the program. Likewise, Nepal National Library, various government libraries and public library, library associations, NGOs, INGOs were members of the committee. The Successive meeting finalized the slogan "Let's read, learn: Let's go to the library for continuous education" (पढौं, पढाऔं : निरन्तर शिक्षाका लागि पुस्तकालय जाऔं) for the Library Day. Various subcommittees such as Slogan selection subcommittee, Facilitation and Prize distribution subcommittee, Publication subcommittee, Social and creative activities subcommittee, Publication subcommittee were formed for the celebration of Library Day.

The main ceremony was organized in Russian Centre of Science & Culture, Kamalpokhari, Kathmandu. Mr. Ramkrishna Subedi, secretary of the MoEST was chairperson of the program. Hon. Minister of MoEST, Mr. Devendra Raj Poudel was the Chief guest and Hon. state minister, MoEST Mrs. Bodhmaya

A Webinar on Medicinal Uses of Home Spices



Main Organizing Committee and Social and Creative Activities Subcommittee organized a webinar on Medicinal use of home spices on 2 September 2022. Acting Executive Director of Resource Centre for Primary HealthCare (RECPEC) Ms. Chandra Kiran Shrestha introduced the main speaker of the program Dr. Puneshwar Kesari, Ayurveda Physician in the Department of Ayurveda and Alternative Medicine, Teku. He introduced various essential kitchen spices used in Nepali kitchen and their medicinal significance. Such spices included coriander, garlic, ginger, turmeric,

cumin seed, black pepper, cloves, bay leaf, cardamom, black cardamom, cinnamon, red pepper, fenugreek, carom/thyme seed, aniseed etc. He further explained that various researches have proved such spices to have anti-bacterial, anti-viral, and anti-parasitic properties and are also used as medicine in Ayurveda and other alternative and traditional medicine. Spices are an integral part of Nepali cuisine. These spices have a great role in the uniqueness and taste of Nepali food.

Webinar on Dengue Disease

On 3 September 2022, The Library Day main organizing committee and social and creative activities sub-committee organized a webinar on Dengue: current situation, challenges, and its solutions, the Main speaker was Dr. Sher Bahadur Pun from Shukraraj Tropical and Communicable Diseases Hospital, Teku Kathmandu. Acting Executive Director of RECPEC Ms. Chandra Kiran Shrestha hosted the program where Member Secretary of Main Organizing Committee Mr. Yadab Chandra Niraula welcomed the guests. Dr. Pun shared his experience and

said Dengue was first confirmed in Nepal in 2004 and became an epidemic in 2019, which is caused from mosquito bite named Aedes aegypti and has spread in 73 districts of Nepal. There are four types of dengue. Therefore, a person can have dengue four times in his life, he added. He further spoke about the symptoms, prevention and cure of dengue.
